Welcome to the U.S. Global Road Safety Decade of Action Working Group Meeting!

This past November, I attended the first Global Ministerial Conference on Road Safety in Moscow, hosted by Russian President Dmitry Medvedev. Our Commission called for a Decade of Action for Road Safety with the goal of reducing the forecasted level of road deaths in 2020 by 50 percent, a call that became an integral part of the Moscow Declaration.

You are meeting today in a building with a history rich in lifesaving action and we now have an historic opportunity to work together to make the world's roads safer. We can prevent 5 million deaths and 50 million serious injuries, while saving \$3 trillion. We have the knowledge to achieve this ambitious goal with solutions such as increasing seat belt and helmet use, reducing drunk driving and speeding, and investing in safer roads and vehicles.

Road crashes kill 1.3 million people every year and will be the leading cause of death and disability for children by 2015. Deaths will reach 2 million a year by 2030. This is a public health, transportation, economic development, and humanitarian disaster, but one that is preventable – if we work together.

I wish you a successful and productive meeting. Thanks a million for your dedication and hard work in making the Decade of Action for Road Safety truly a time of coordinated and lifesaving action!
