

Promoting safe walking and cycling



Share the Road supports governments and city authorities in developing countries to prioritise investment in walking and cycling infrastructure.

The FIA Foundation launched Share the Road in 2008 with UN Environment, who manage the initiative and its programme of activities together with implementing partners. Share the Road aims to focus the global agenda on walking and cycling, provide tools and guidance and practical in-country support to catalyse real improvements on city streets. This is a 'triple win' in terms of:

TRIPLE WIN




Share the Road provides practical support for city authorities, including supporting the design and construction of a **pilot corridor** showing top-class pedestrian and cyclist infrastructure in Nairobi in 2011. It has released tailored resources for developing countries including NMT design guidelines and a Cost Benefit Analysis tool.

It also published the world's first **Global outlook on walking and cycling** in 2016 at the Habitat III conference in Quito, which aims to share good practice about policies.



IN COUNTRY SUPPORT



Brazil

With partner World Resources Institute Brazil, Share the Road has supported a nationwide review on road safety legislation and school children, including work with schools to engage children about safe and healthy routes.

Ghana

With partner Institute for Transportation Development Policy (ITDP), Share the Road is working with the Ministry of Transport and the National Road Safety Commission to develop a National NMT policy in 2017.

Nigeria

With partner ITDP, the Lagos Metropolitan Transport Authority developed NMT policy for Lagos in 2016. The Federal Ministry of Transport are also improving their Federal Transport Policy to include a heavier emphasis on NMT. Both agencies will also undertake street design training for key staff.

Zambia

The government of Zambia has invited Share the Road to support the implementation of a NMT policy.

Burundi

The Ministry of Works and Transport successfully completed an environmental and social impact assessment for a pilot NMT corridor and have committed to developing a National NMT policy in 2017.

Kenya

Share the Road has been working in Kenya since 2009, With Share the Road's support, the Nairobi City County Government launched a NMT policy in 2015 which committed 20% of their road construction budget to NMT investment.

Share the Road also supports the Child Health and Mobility Initiative (CHMI). This includes work with schools in Brazil to map journeys to school, examine the quality of sidewalks and identify

improvements, and work with schools in Kenya to assess the air quality around schools and identify actions that can reduce exposure. By bringing the perspective of children to city planners and decision makers, Share the Road provides a powerful voice for change.
